## **Lighting of Shabbat Candles**

The candles are lit before the blessing is recited.

Baruch Atah, Adonai, Eloheinu, Melech Haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav, v'tzivanu l'hadlik ner shel Shabbat.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of the universe, who hallows us with mitzvot, commanding us to kindle the light of Shabbat.

## It is traditional to bless children each Shabbat and on every holiday.

Place your hands on the head of the child and recite:

When blessing girls, start with these lines:

ְיְשִׂימֵדְּ אֱלֹהִים כְּשָׂרָה, כְּרִבְקָה, כִּרָחֵל וּכִלֵאָה.

Y'simeich Elohim k'Sarah, Rivkah, Rachel, v'Leah. May God make you like Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel and Leah.

When blessing boys, start with these lines:

יָשִׁימְדָּ אֱלֹהִים כְּאֶפְרַיִם וְכִמְנַשֶּׁה.

*Y'simcha Elohim k'Efrayim v'che-Menasheh.*May God make you like Ephraim and Menasheh.
