
"Can Robots be Jewish? and other pressing questions of modern life"

In "Can Robots be Jewish," the rabbis' responses span the range of modern Jewish thought and include Independent, Humanist, Jewish Renewal, Reconstructionist, Reform, Conservative, Orthodox, Sephardic, Chabad perspectives.
