2022 Annual Community Commitment Summary for Those Joining in 2022

(January to December calendar year; prorated if joining after January; certain minimums apply)

Community Commitment is based on the principle that we all share responsibility for the financial health of our synagogue. All congregants are asked to fulfill their annual community commitment to enable us to continue our programs, maintain our spiritual home, and support our sacred community's activities.

With a desire for fairness and inclusivity, we ask each congregant/family to support the cost of operations in a manner that reflects their individual financial circumstances. We ask that congregants determine their level of support using the following considerations:

Annual Base Community Commitment: A standard "Base Community Commitment" amount is a starting point for all congregants. Standard Base: <u>\$3,485</u>

<u>"Allowances"</u>: Certain allowances (i.e., reductions) to the standard Base Community Commitment are available for congregants who determine that the standard Base Community Commitment is too burdensome AND who meet specific criteria (i.e.,1-adult family, 1-adult family age 65+, 2-adult family both age 65+).

*Two-adult families consist of two adults who are spouses or domestic partners or are sharing the same household. Each adult is a congregant, and a non-Jewish adult within a unit is a congregant for all purposes. All two-adult families are subject to the two-adult rate, regardless of level of participation of both adults.
